31 MARCH (WEDNESDAY)

Departure from the Malta International Airport

Arrival at Tunis international Airport .

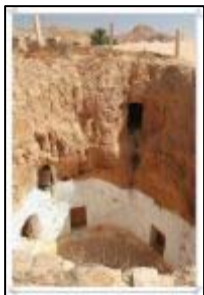
Transfer to the **Aziza Thalasso Golf Hotel** (4 stars) in Hammamet.

Overnight.

01 APRIL (THURSDAY)

After breakfast departure for the adventure with an English speaking guide and 4X4 and drive to **EI JEM** to visit its ancient Roman Amphitheatre:

The Roman Amphitheatre: It is capable of seating 35,000 spectators. Only Rome's Colosseum (about 45,000 spectators) and the ruined theatre of Capua are larger. The amphitheatre at



El Djem was built by the Romans under proconsul Gordian, who was acclaimed Emperor at Thysdrus, around 238 and was probably mainly used for gladiator shows and chariot races. Its stones were used for building the nearby village of El Djem and transported to the Great Mosque in Kairouan. The ruins of the amphitheatre were declared a World Heritage Site in 1979

After the visit drive to **Matmata** via Mehares and Sfax to have **Lunch in Hotel Marhala** .

After Lunch, visit of a cave dwelling house and a Berber family. Then drive to **Douz**. Douz is a town in central Tunisia, known as the "Gateway to the Sahara." In previous times it was an important stop on the trans-Saharan caravan routes. Douz is a major palm oasis and as such a large producer of "diglat noor" dates. On arrival you will be able to make an optional camel ride to discover the sand dunes.



Check in at the Hotel **Sun Palm Douz (4 stars)**, Dinner and overnight.

02 APRIL (FRIDAY)



After breakfast, departure from the hotel in Douz to Tozeur via the salt lake of **Chott El Jerid**. Short stop to contemplate the phenomenon of mirage and why not make some pictures of it.

On Arrival to Tozeur you will visit the mountain oases of **Chebika** and waterfall of **Tamerza**.



Drive to Gafsa to have **lunch in Hotel Jugurtha Palace**. After lunch Drive **to Kairouan** to make a panoramic visit of this holy city and discover the great Mosque which is The oldest mosque in North Africa and one of the world's oldest minarets, there are 414 columns in the Great Mosque. Almost all were take from Roman ruins.

Proceed to Hammamet. Check in at Hotel **Aziza Thalasso Golf (4 stars)** dinner and overnight .

03 APRIL (SATURDAY)

In the Morning visit of **Hammamet** and surrounding interesting sites such as the Museum of Dar Khadija (or house of Khadija) which is very interesting because it relates all the History and

traditions of the beautiful town of Hammamet and after make the visit of the fort of Hammamet and see the interesting old building.

Return to the hotel **Aziza Thalasso Golf** to have Lunch.

Afternoon at leisure at the hotel.

Dinner and overnight at the hotel.



04 APRIL (SUNDAY)

After Breakfast departure to visit The **Bardo Museum** The ancient residence of the Beys (dynasty ruling Tunisia from 1705 to 1957), the palace of Bardo hosts from 1888 the archaeological Museum. First mosaic museum in the world with a thousand of masterpieces, the Bardo museum is unique with invaluable value.



Drive to the Capital of Tunis to have a free time visit of the **traditional Madina**.

Lunch in the Restaurant of Dar Hammouda Pacha.

After Lunch drive to **Carthage**. Carthage refers both to an ancient city in Tunisia and to the civilization that developed within the city's sphere of influence.

The city of Carthage is located on the eastern side of Lake Tunis across from the center of Tunis According to legend it was founded by Phoenician colonists under the leadership of Elissa (Queen Dido). Nowadays, we can admire the archaeological site of Carthage, the magnificent features of the Antonin Thermeas and those of the two Punic ports.





You proceed to **Sidi Bou Said** :The town got its name for a Muslim religious figure who lived there , Abou Said ibn Khalef ibn Yahia Ettamini el Beji. The town is also known for the extensive use of blue and white colors all over the town. All kinds of souvenirs can be bought in the main street. Sidi Bou Said is still under reputation as a town of artists. Many famous artists lived there or visited Sidi Bou Said. Most famous is probably Paul Klee.
